## Paul C. Ajamian, O.D., F.A.A.O.

Paul C. Ajamian, O.D., F.A.A.O., is a graduate of the University of Vermont and the New England College of Optometry. He moved to Atlanta and was instrumental in starting the first Comanagement Center in the U.S. in 1982. Since 1984 he has served as Center Director of Omni Eye Services of Atlanta, the first Optometric Co-Management Center in the country. He is author of two textbooks, and is editor of Review of Optometry's popular monthly column "Co-Management Q and A". He is an internationally known speaker, and also serves as General Chairman of the Education Committee for SECO International, sponsor of the largest optometric convention in the U.S. In 1995, Dr. Ajamian was chosen as the "Optometrist of the South" by his peers in the Southeast, and in 2000 was voted one of the ten "Optometrists of the Decade" by Optometric Management magazine and its readers. He continues to be involved in the Georgia Optometric Association in legislative activities, and is a past president of the organization.



## Joseph Sowka, OD, FAAO, Diplomate

Dr. Joseph Sowka received his Bachelor of Sciences degree from Cornell University and his Doctor of Optometry degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry (PCO). He completed a Residency at PCO.

Dr. Sowka is a Professor of Optometry at Nova Southeastern University College of Optometry. He is also Chief of Advanced Care and Director of Glaucoma Services at The Eye Care Institute of Nova Southeastern University.

Dr. Sowka is an Associate Editor and a member of Editorial Review Board for Optometry- The Journal of the American Optometric Association. He is also a Contributing Editor for Review of Optometry. He is the lead author on The Handbook of Ocular Disease Management. Dr. Sowka lectures nationally and internationally and has authored numerous publications and book chapters. Dr. Sowka is a founding member of both the Optometric Glaucoma Society and Optometric Retina Society and is an executive board member for both societies. He is also on the Glaucoma Advisory Board for Alcon laboratories. Dr. Sowka is a Diplomate of the American Academy of Optometry – Disease Section, Glaucoma Subsection. Dr. Sowka currently is Diplomate Chair for the Disease Section of the American Academy of Optometry.



# Fouad Tayfour, MD, FRCSC Medical Director and Surgeon of the Windsor Laser Eye Institute

Dr. Tayfour received his medical degree from Damascus University (Syria) in 1979 and completed his residency in Ophthalmology at the University of Toronto from 1984 through 1987. The following year, he completed a Retina and

Vitreous Fellowship at the University of Toronto.

Since establishing his private practice in 1988, Dr. Tayfour has been on the forefront of new technologies. In 1991 he helped to introduce clear corneal incision and cataract surgery under topical anesthesia in Canada and in the same year founded the Windsor Laser Eye Institute. Dr. Tayfour was the first surgeon in North America to perform LASIK

He has authored and co-authored articles for such esteemed publications as the Canadian Journal of Ophthalmology, Ocular News,The Journal of Refractive Surgery and Ophthalmic Practice. Dr.Tayfour has also lectured at many medical conferences and seminars. He is an active member with numerous professional medical societies.



## Philip E. Walling, OD, FAAO

Dr. Walling received his doctorate in Optometry from the University of Houston College of Optometry and is TPA certified in Michigan and Texas. Following graduation, he was an Associate Clinical Professor at the University of Houston's University Eye Institute and practiced in a multidisciplinary setting until moving to Michigan. After relocating to Michigan, Dr. Walling practiced at the University of Michigan Health Service, Associated Eye Institute and Surgical Center and in private practice. He joined the faculty of the Michigan College of Optometry in 1994 and currently holds the rank of Professor, teaching exclusively in the area of ocular disease. Didactically, he is the Course Director for the Ocular Disease Tract in the third professional year. His classes include Posterior Segment Ocular Disease, Glaucoma, Laser & Refractive Surgery and Injectable Pharmaceuticals. Clinically, Dr. Walling is Chief of the Medical and Surgical Service which is a referral service for cataract and eyelid surgery and the treatment of glaucoma. He has lectured extensively both statewide, nationally and internationally on ocular disease, pharmacology, contact lenses and primary care procedures. He was voted "Educator of the Year" by the Michigan Optometric Association in 2000. Dr. Walling is currently the director of continuing education at MCO and serves as faculty liaison on the Academic Relations Committee, Professional Affairs Division of the Michigan Optometric Association. His other interests include being the Assistant Men's and Women's Golf Coach at Ferris State University, teaching in the Ferris State Adult Tennis camps as a certified tennis professional and coaching his son and daughter in organized basketball, baseball, softball and soccer.
